Baptism is a church's act of affirming and portraying a believer's union with Christ by immersing him or her in water, and a believer's act of publicly committing him or herself to Christ and his people, thereby uniting a believer to the church and marking off him or her from the world. - Mark Dever

I. THE MANDATE

Why be baptized? Matthew 28:18-20: Acts 2:38-41

- Baptism is how you publicly identify yourself with Jesus and His people. Acts 2:38-41
- Baptism is how you visibly signify that you are united to Christ in His death, burial, and resurrection. Romans 6:1-4
- Baptism is how you identify as one who belongs to the triune God. Matthew 28:19
- Baptism is how you publicly embrace and submit to Him as Lord. 1 Peter 3:21

II. THE MEANING

What is baptism? What baptism is not! Romans 6:1-11

What is baptism?

Baptism is a picture

- 1. of faith going public
- 2. of forgiveness and cleansing
- 3. of union with Christ in His death, burial, and resurrection. (The gospel)
- 4. of new life

Baptism proclaims 2 Corinthians 5:17

- 1. The past it is a picture of death
- 2. The present it is a picture of a new person, brand new life
- 3. The future it is a picture that one day I will be raised up

What baptism is not!

- 1. Not only a personal matter
- 3. Not merely ritual

- 2. Not re-dedication
- 4. Not salvation

III. THE METHOD

When should someone be baptized? How should someone be baptized?

The method of baptism is wrapped up in its meaning. You cannot change the method without destroying the meaning. - John MacArthur

- · When should someone be baptized? They hear, they believe, and they are baptized
- 1 Corinthians 15:3-4; Romans 10:13-14, 17; Matthew 28:19-20
- How should someone be baptized? A person should be immersed in water
