SERMON NOTES

The most common approach to the subject of marriage and divorce is therapeutic rather than theological. Perhaps you have come today anticipating or expecting to hear one thing or another. My great desire is to simply lay before you the Biblical truth and encourage you to evaluate any and all circumstances from the perspective of God's Word, not opinion, emotion, or life experience. My primary purpose today is to elevate God's standard of permanence in marriage and to encourage those who have been impacted by the tragedy and trauma of divorce.
